1. Planning

- 1. What do we as a club want to achieve?
- 2. How can we achieve it?
- 3. What do we need to achieve it?
- 4. What grant can help us achieve it?
- Retrospective funding
- Facility Development Plans





2. Prepare

- Read the funding guidelines
- Make sure you understand:
 - Eligibility
 - Funding ratios
 - Timelines
 - Key criteria
- Contact the funding provider






3. Write your grant

- Consider criteria weighting. Higher weighting = more effort
- Word limits
- Clearly show benefits
 - Participation
 - Target under-represented groups
 - Increase functionality
 - Wider project benefit
 - Other users?
- Supporting documentation
 - Letters of support
 - Quotes
 - Strategic documents
 - Study reports










'How can I improve my next application to ensure it is successful?'








Handy Tips

23/02/2020

- Plan first, apply second Make sure you do your planning before applying for a grant.
- Think strategic Put your application in early
- Relationship building Contact the funder to discuss your application before the closing date.
- Meet your requirements Complete milestone reports, acknowledgement of funding providers etc.
- **Reassess** If your application is not successful, ask why.


