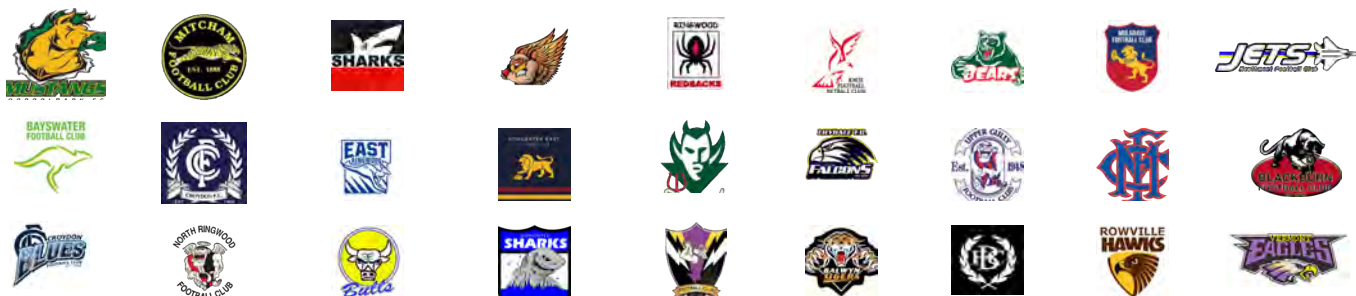

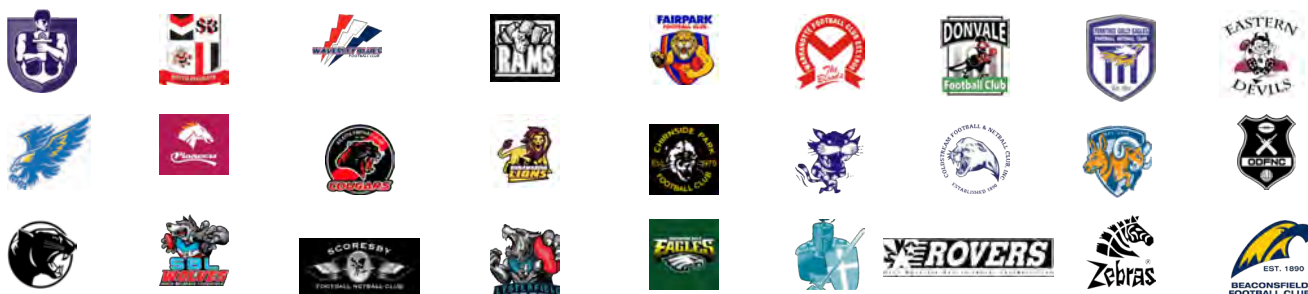

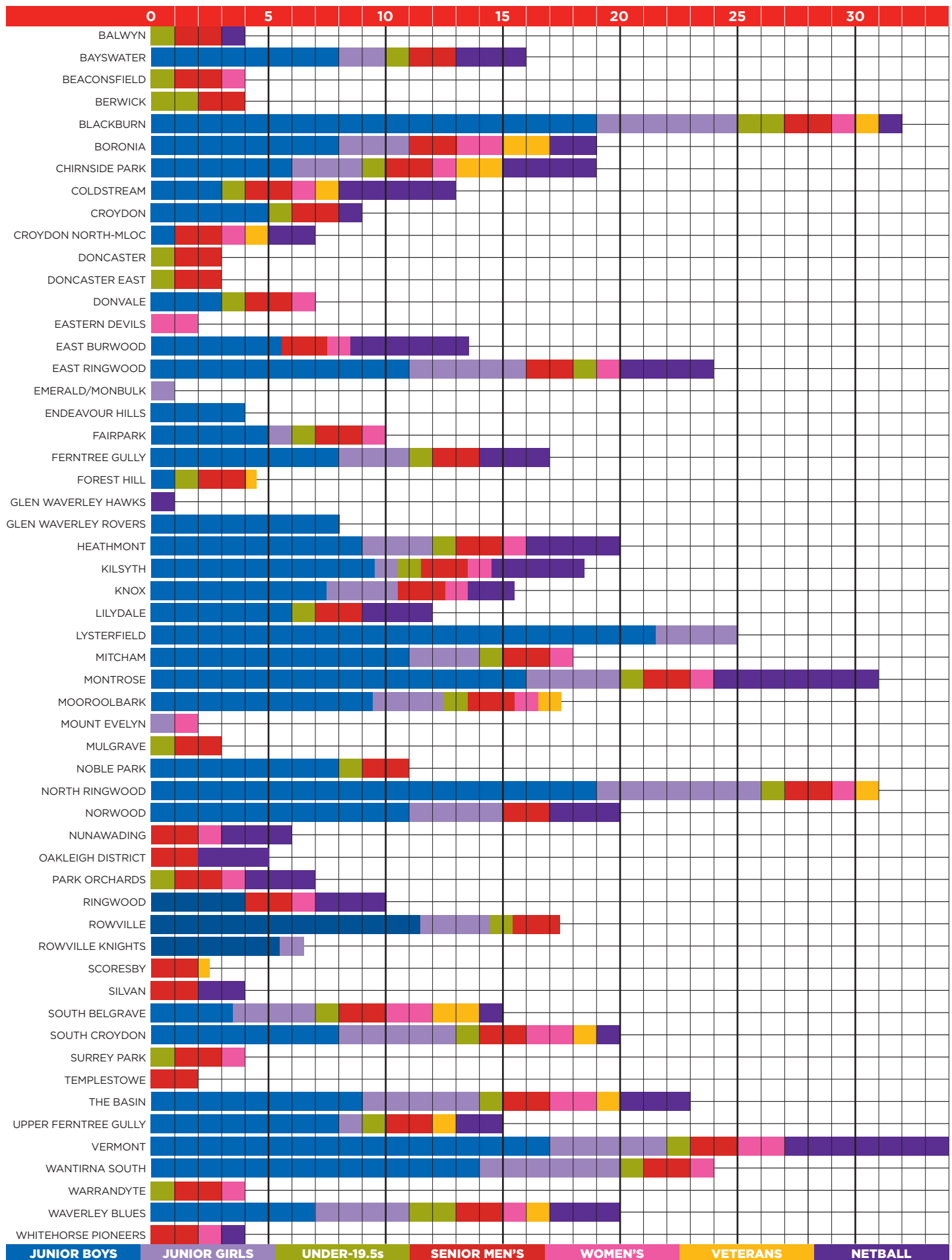

From the Chair

I AM PLEASED TO BE DELIVERING THE ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE EASTERN FOOTBALL NETBALL LEAGUE FOR 2023 AS MY FIRST YEAR AS CHAIR.

This season has been marked by remarkable success and growth across both our football and netball competitions, reaffirming our position as one of the largest and most successful community sporting leagues in the country.

I would like to extend my thanks to long term naming rights partner Eastland, for their unwavering support and continued investment in our league. Eastland's partnership with us extends until the end of 2025. We have conducted numerous activations this year with the finals fest and school holiday experience's being a highlight.

I also extend our appreciation to our major Sponsors, including BJS Insurance, Deakin University, Bendigo Bank, Yarra Valley Water, and carsales. In 2023, we welcomed a new major sponsor, MEGT, to our league. We are also thankful for the support of our other valued sponsors and community partners which are listed in the front of this report.

Congratulations to all the teams that clinched premierships this year in our football and netball competitions. The attendance and crowd behaviour were outstanding, and the support for our teams and participants was tremendous. Highlights were Rowville winning their maiden Premier Division flag and Surrey Park winning their first ever EFNL premiership. In Premier Division Senior Womens, Eastern Devils celebrated back to back premierships coming from behind in the final quarter to snatch the win by three points over SBL Wolves. East Ringwood went back to back in Bendigo Bank Division One netball defeating Croydon by 7 goals.

The EFNL has continued to strengthen relationships and increase awareness through key partnerships and activations throughout the season. Our partnerships with organizations such as TAC, Good Sports, ANZAC Day Appeal, Victorian Responsible Gambling Foundation, Blue Ribbon Foundation, METEC driver training, Breast Cancer Network Australia, Eastern Health, Fight MND and NAIDOC Week. We have continued to develop our partnership with the Hawthorn Football Club who have been pivotal in our community engagement efforts.

Our umpires play a significant role in our league, and we remain committed to supporting their endeavours and development. Our umpires continued to utilize the outstanding Springfield Pavilion along with the Eastern Football League Umpires Association (EFLUA). We also extend our thanks to outgoing President Maurice De Vincentis and his committee for their support of the league. We also thank Umpire Manager Scott Van Noordennen and Junior Field Umpire Head Coach Sean Clarke for their dedicated efforts in managing appointments for our umpires. The league was excited to welcome over 200 new umpires in 2023 to in excess of 600.

The league maintained its financial strength throughout the year, despite the increasing costs associated with running the league. We will report a small surplus, reflecting our commitment to fiscal responsibility and sustainability. This result rests on the ability to balance a small team and strict budget management. The investment with human resources must be enhanced to ensure the level of service is maintained in line with the growth of the league.

The EFNL Board is made up of diverse and highly skilled individuals who bring a vast array of skills to the league and drive the governance and management of the league. We have once again been served diligently by the Board in 2023.

I would like to express my gratitude to Graham Halbish for his exceptional service during his tenure as Chair. Graham led the league through numerous changes and advances, including the introduction of Women's football and netball leagues, the CCSP (Points and Salary Cap system), league expansion, competition restructuring, financial stability, and navigating the challenges posed by the COVID period. I would like to thank board member Tim Finemore for his tenure as Vice Chair, as he steps down. Kevin Smith has assumed the role of Vice Chair.

Board member Leon Bailey has remained the lead of our EFNL Junior committee, and the team once again played an integral supporting role to Junior Manager Paul Giannopoulos. The committee continued their outstanding efforts throughout the junior season.

From the CEO

THIS YEAR MARKED THE BEGINNING OF MY TENURE AS CEO, WITH THE PRIVILEGE OF MANAGING THIS GREAT COMPETITION, AND IT HAS BEEN A YEAR FILLED WITH PRIDE, AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOMPLISHMENTS.

With immense gratitude and enthusiasm, I reflect on my first year as CEO of EFNL, and I am humbled to have been entrusted with the responsibility of overseeing this great league. The dedication of our member clubs and EFNL staff has been evident throughout the year.

Over the past season, the league has continued to evolve, adapt, and embrace change, all while staying true to our core values and key pillars of our strategic plan - Clubs, Participation, Community and Partnerships, Operational Excellence and Financial Management.

I am incredibly proud of what we have accomplished during this time. We saw strong crowd numbers all season and significant growth in female participation across the league. We saw innovation with the first under-8 girls' competition in Australia and the introduction of the summer netball competition.

Pleasingly the league welcomed new corporate partners and cultivated new strategic partnerships in 2023. We will continue to expand our league again in 2024 with the inclusion of Beaconsfield Junior Football Club, ensuring the alignment with their senior club.

Moving forward into 2024, we will continue to prioritise innovation, sustainability, and excellence. We will look to grow and find new ways to add value to our members.

I am grateful for the trust and support of our EFNL board, in particular Chair Paul Barlow.

I would also like to acknowledge our outgoing Chair Graham Halbish, Vice Chair Tim Finemore, and welcome incoming Vice Chair Kevin Smith.

This year, our finals series welcomed warm weather and clear skies in turn we saw large crowds out supporting their teams. Congratulations to all winners across our divisions.

Our coverage of the finals and Grand Finals continued across our social platforms and live streams, as we celebrated those premiership and Grand Final teams. Our Media team also put together video packages for a few of the Grand Final sides in the lead-up to their matches. This included an insight into both Premier Grand Final teams Rowville and Vermont, which was presented at the Grand Final Lunch.

Social media platforms have again allowed us to continue the promotion of our league and deliver increased numbers of engagement and interaction over the season.

This year we incorporated drone footage at the Senior Men's Grand Final that was used before, during and after the games. Online streams had great numbers across all final's games, with the live broadcast of the Premier Division Grand Final between Rowville and Vermont receiving 25,000 views across YouTube and Facebook. More than 40,000 viewers tuned into the Senior Grand Finals including Men's, Women's, Reserves, Under 19.5's and Veterans.

Season 2023 saw our games conducted across Friday nights, Saturday, Saturday nights, Sundays with games held on Good Friday and ANZAC Day.

The Community Club Sustainability Policy (CCSP) has shown its value to the integrity of the competition with promoted teams being able to compete at the higher divisions instantly and constantly across the season. This was highlighted with East Ringwood spending several weeks on top of the Premier Division ladder after promotion from Division 1. The CCSP has continued to keep our club debtors low and allow clubs the ability to work within their means and reduce the burden on volunteers.

Senior Women's football in the east grows year on year with over 40 teams in 2023.

Our live coverage of the Deakin University Senior Women's competition continued again in season 2023. One game was streamed live every Saturday morning via our YouTube and Facebook pages.

This season also saw excellent growth in participation in the Junior girls and Senior women's competitions, with participation reaching a record-high with 185 senior teams, 400 junior team and 87 netball teams comprising more than 16,000 registered participants combined.

Congratulations to our four 300-game life members who were inducted this year - Grattan Stephens, James O'Sullivan, Daniel King and Scott Dimitriou.

The Junior league returned its largest team count since 2019, with 401 boys and girls teams fielded across 45 divisions. Junior participation numbers were up this season to 9,024 from 8,661 in 2022. Introducing the White Card into our junior competition saw 40 Stage 1, 4 Stage 2 and Stage 3 White Cards issued.

Girl's football continued to go from strength to strength, with a 10% increase in teams from 2022. The league was excited to introduce its inaugural Under 8 Girls competition in July 2023, with 39 girls entering the 4-week competition at Kings Park Reserve in Upper Ferntree Gully.

Non-competitive teams (Under 8's/9's and 10's) were up 5% from 2023 with 99 teams taking the field across 11 Divisions. Mixed and boy's teams also saw a 3% increase and are now back above pre-COVID numbers.

It was a highly competitive netball competition this season. It was terrific to see the hard work and dedication of our clubs and their coordinators coming through, growing from 71 teams in 2022 to 87 teams registered from 31 senior clubs.

We saw a total of 1484 registered players, an increase from 1226 registered players in season 2022.

Overall, the performance by our umpires in the 2023 Junior and Senior home & finals series was strong. We saw 90 umpires transition from junior umpiring to senior games in both men's and women's football competitions in field, boundary, and goal umpiring. With our junior umpires, of the 270 new umpires that registered for the 2023 season 250 (93%) umpired games in either junior, goal or boundary. We had a fill rate of 97% which is a testament to our umpiring department.

This season, on-field player behaviour has been outstanding, aside from a few high-profile incidents. Regrettably, we had an increase in poor off-field spectator behaviour with the prevalence of umpire abuse, that became evident across all levels of community sport. Moving ahead we will continue to prioritise umpire welfare and invest in education and awareness in this area.

I'd like to thank Maurice De Vincentis for his tenure as President of the EFLUA and wish him all the best as he departs the position. I welcome David Parker into the role and look forward to continuing the relationship between the EFNL and EFLUA.

As our competition continues to grow, the facilities must also grow to meet the needs. With our local councils continuing to be significant investors in sporting facilities, we will continue to work closely with them, the state and federal governments and AFL Victoria.

2024 will see the introduction of the Fair Access Policy with local government authorities that will mandate a level of requirement of female participation for community leagues to meet to ensure funding. This will be a large body of work to be conducted across the communities within the EFNL LGA'S.

Breaking new ground is another endeavour community leagues have undertaken with the AFL to deliver new playing fields to meet demand. The aim is to have these unused spaces developed to suit our growing game. The EFNL will work closely in this area to utilise any potential venues that can cater to our playing needs.

As a league, we pursue ways of innovating to assist our members and grow our core business. We continued to prioritise, sustainability, and excellence in our operations. In 2024 we will transition to a new administration platform called PLAYHQ to further enhance our efficiency and align with all other metro leagues. PLAYHQ is now at the stage where we are comfortable with the transition and its capabilities.

Our successful final series saw large crowd numbers and the EFNL was afforded an important revenue stream that allowed us to post a small surplus after significant operational expenditure for season 2023.

The League covers the cost of senior umpires throughout our finals series, which is a significant investment, and continued with our match-day footage and weekly live streaming of the match of the round and the finals series. We resisted the request to charge for our match day streaming and maintained live stream footage free of charge.

The cost of doing business has increased over the last 12 months. We are fortunate to have built up cash reserves over the years, and our balance at EOFY sees us at our strongest position with the conviction to take us through the summer periods and into the new year.

Projecting forward to 2024, we predict an increase to our insurance policy and again cost of running the business in line with growing

industry costs and inflation. We will remain diligent in our budgeting to keep our member costs as flat as possible. Our ability to invest up-front in our policy depletes the balance considerably, however, allows the league to get a reduced premium for our clubs. We do however see an increase in costs in 2024 that some must be passed back to clubs.

We have been represented by a talented and high-performing staff again in 2023, with our small team who work over and above for the league and our members. We welcomed Administration Manager Kirsty Jamieson into our team, who has been an asset to the business and hit the ground running with her knowledge of club land and PlayHQ. Along with the new, we will see the departure of our Junior Football Manager Paul Giannopoulos. Paul's determination and work ethic facilitated the success of the junior competition. His tenure at the league saw an increase in junior teams to 400 in 2023, an improved and streamlined interleague program aligning with the pathway system and managing the girls under 8's competition.

I thank the EFNL team for their support and commitment throughout the year in providing our clubs with the highest level of service. The EFNL Board, Junior Committee, Umpires' Association, Trainers Association, Tribunal and League Investigators all continue to make significant contributions to the smooth running of the League.

Finally, thank you to all the wonderful volunteers and supporters across the EFNL. It has been great to reconnect with many of you and I am excited for what the future holds with this great league.

I wish everyone a safe and enjoyable off-season and a successful season in 2024.

Football Operations

THE EASTERN FOOTBALL NETBALL LEAGUE CONTINUES TO DELIVER HIGH QUALITY DIVISIONS ACROSS THE WIDE- RANGING COMPETITIONS IN BOTH THE MEN'S AND WOMEN'S SPACE. TEAM NUMBERS IN SENIOR COMPETITIONS GREW FOR THE 8TH CONSECUTIVE YEAR, TOTTALLING 185, THANKS TO THE CONTINUED GROWTH IN FEMALE FOOTBALL.

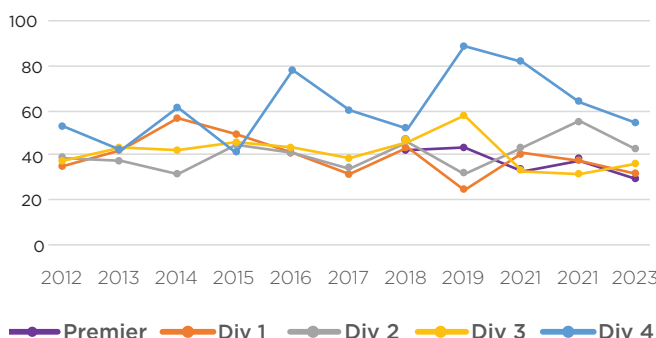
DIVISION COMPETITIVENESS

The evenness across the majority of Senior Divisions was prevalent in season 2023, with our topflight Premier Men's and Premier Women's Divisions both boasting average margins under five goals for the season.

Division 1 Men's continues to showcase some of our most competitive football - 50% of games played finished with a winning margin under 25 points. This was reflected in the ladder as majority of teams battled it out for finals positions until the final rounds of the season.

For the first time since 2018, Division 4 Mens had an average margin of under 10 goals. The improvement of Nunawading and Croydon North MLOC, coupled with the even spread at the top end of the ladder ensured the closest Division 4 season in several years. By way of perspective - in 2019, 28 games in Division 4 were won by 100+ points, in 2023 just eight games fell over the 15-goal marker.

Average Margin - Senior Men



Grading in the Division 3 and 4 Divisions in Senior Women provided a greater scope of competition leading to a tight tussle for finals spots particularly in Division 4 (average margin of 22 points).

Despite a couple of front runners in our Senior Women's Divisions competitiveness was still evident with 54% of Premier Division games falling under the four-goal mark. A quarter of games in Division 1 and 2 were decided by less than 25 points with the average margin in these Divisions around the 30 point mark.

PROMOTED SIDES PLAYING FINALS

The benefits of the implementation of the Community Club Sustainability Policy were on show in 2023. The cap on player points and in particular player payments once again led to an increase in competitiveness within Divisions.

All four promoted (2022) Premiers in Senior Men's football played finals in 2023 - notably East Ringwood in their first foray back in the topflight held down a top two position for most of the season.

South Belgrave proved they were a force to be reckoned with as they completed a home and away season without defeat. Since the start of the 2019 season, the Saints have won 89% of matches including two Senior Premierships - a truly enviable record.

Unfortunately for the Saints they were confronted on Grand Final Day by a rampaging Mitcham side who willed themselves over the line to claim the Division 1 Premiership.

Waverley Blues continued their progression into Division 2, fast becoming a challenger to the title. Unfortunately, their finals campaign saw them edged out by more experienced opposition in the first two weeks of the finals.

After claiming the Division 4 title in 2022, Silvan finished their season a kick away from a Preliminary Final, falling agonisingly short to Oakleigh District in the First Semi Final.

NEW WOMENS TEAMS

Senior Women's football in the East grows year on year.

With the return of Waverley Blues and the inclusion of Warrandyte and Wantirna South numbers jumped to over 40 teams for the first time. Couple this with the increase at both the bottom end - Junior girls, and the top end - Veterans Women's and the pathway is coming together for females to transition through our competitions.



The inclusion of Boronia and eventual Premiers South Belgrave into the Veterans Women's competition saw the team numbers grow to five. By way of context there are currently 13 Women's 35+ teams in Victoria – 40% of which are fielded in our competition.

SEASON REVIEW

- The Premier Division Mens season kicked off with the traditional Balwyn v Blackburn Good Friday game with the Tigers taking the opening round honours. Newly promoted East Ringwood unfurled their flag under lights against South Croydon with the Bulldogs victorious in a tight one.
- Eastern Devils hosted South Croydon as they unfurled their first Premier Division Premiership in the EFNL – The Devils went on to make it back-to-back in 2023.
- Grading in Senior Women's Division 3 and 4 occurred over the first month of the season allowing for the league to gauge the skill level of the new entrants into the competition and place them accordingly.
- 23 matches in Senior Men's and Senior Women's competitions were hosted in twilight or night time slots showing that the appetite for night football is growing.

- Of the 270+ Senior Women's Matches played in 2023, more than 85% were played in the 8:50am or 10:40am timeslots a far cry from the erratic scheduling of previous seasons.

- Senior Women's Finals were once again well attended culminating in Grand Final day hosted by Heathmont and North Ringwood. Seven Premiers were crowned across both venues including the BJS Men's Veterans and Women's Veterans.

- Eastern Devils made it back-to-back whilst Boronia claimed the Division 1 title. East Ringwood cruised to the flag in Division 2. Kilsyth took the honours in Division 3 Womens and Mooroolbark claimed the Premiership in emphatic style in Division 4.

- The league once again partnered with INTIX to manage Senior Men's finals ticketing allowing for card entry to be taken at all venues.

- Following a high calibre, well attended finals series – Surrey Park, Donvale, Boronia, Mitcham, and Rowville took out the Senior Men's Premierships. The latter becoming the first club in the leagues history to claim a Senior Premiership in all five Divisions.

To those rewarded for their individual efforts, recognized by way of our Competitions Awards – well done on your incredible seasons.

Junior Football

2023 A YEAR OF GROWTH

The league returned its largest team count since 2019 with 401 boys and girls junior teams fielded across 45 divisions. Junior participation numbers were up this season to 9,024 from 8,661 in 2022.

Girls football continued to go from strength to strength with a 10% increase on teams from the 2022 season. The league was excited to introduce its inaugural Under 8 Girls competition in July 2023. Thirty nine girls entered the 4-week competition which was played at Kings Park Reserve - Upper Ferntree Gully.

Mixed and boy's teams also saw a 3% increase and are now back above pre covid numbers.

Non-competitive teams (Under 8's/9's and 10's) were also up 5% on 2022 with 99 teams taking the field across 11 Divisions. This increase saw the introduction of a third centralized Under 8 venue at Kimberley Reserve - Chirnside Park.

The league's Junior Representative Academy also continues to grow with 6 sides competing in the AFL Victoria Junior Development Series. The league added a second Under 15 Girls team in 2023 which competed in Division Two of the series.

The 2023 Junior Academy began in February with an AFL style testing day completed by new EFNL Academy partners Project Gap.

The league held internal trial matches hosted by Eastern Ranges. Full trial matches were then held against Northern Football Netball League in the April school holidays at Wally Tew Oval, Ferntree Gully.

The Hawthorn Football Club continued its strong support of the EFNL Junior Academy, not only supporting the league with on-field football jumpers but also hosting the representatives for both a training day and jumper presentation night.

The AFL Victoria Development series was a fantastic success in 2023 with both Under 15 Girls teams remaining undefeated. The Under 14 Division 1 boys also went undefeated in their three games. Overall, the EFNL completed the series with 13 wins out of the 18 games played.

The Academy coaches were once again superbly headed up by Wayne Judge. Thank you to the entire 2023 coaching panel Wayne Judge (14 Div. 1) Greg Walker (14 Div.2) , Dean Jones (15 Div. 1), Rhian Greaves (15 Div.2), Julian Cosgrave (15 Girls Div. 1), Michelle Williams and Rhonda McMillian (15 Girls Div.2).

The EFNL Junior Finals Series began in late July with 18 clubs hosting finals, many for their clubs first time. In a great sign of the competitiveness of the junior competition, 35 of the leagues 39 clubs were represented in week 1 of the final series.

EFNL Junior Grand Final Day was held on August 13th, 2023, with 10 host venues conducting 37 Grand Finals. 24 of the 39 clubs competing in the EFNL junior season had Grand final representation. Seventeen different clubs claimed a premiership on the day.

I would like to congratulate all clubs and host venues on a massive 2023 finals series which saw huge crowds and great football.

THE 2023 EFNL NETBALL SEASON SAW NINE DIFFERENT CLUBS BECOME PREMIERS!

It was a highly competitive Netball competition this season. It was terrific to see the hard work and dedication of our clubs and their coordinators coming through, growing from 71 teams in 2022 to 87 teams registered from 31 senior clubs. We saw a total of 1484 registered players, an increase from 1226 registered players in season 2022. The competition welcomed Bayswater to the competition for the first time with an impressive 3 teams and the return of Blackburn and Norwood following a small break. Each of our 9 divisions provided all teams and clubs the opportunity for success.

We are excited to commence our first ever summer competition this year to be held at Pinks Reserve, Kilsyth, which sees 25 teams registered from 14 clubs.

VENUE PROCUREMENT

The league secured four high quality venues this season, with the return of Knox Regional Netball Centre with their newly built two courts:

- Waverley Netball Centre
- Knox Regional Netball Centre
- HE Parker Netball Complex
- Oxley College Stadium

For 2024, we have secured 4 exceptional venues, including the newly refurbished indoor courts in the existing stadium at Knox Regional Netball Centre, providing 4 fully operational courts.

This will allow our competition to continue to expand and through our continued engagement and management of these venues, we look forward to witnessing our netball competition grow from strength to strength, offering further opportunities for our players, clubs, and volunteers.

COMPETITION REVIEW

Division 1 was highly competitive again this season, with Vermont and Coldstream being elevated following a strong 2022 season. Croydon had another fantastic season, becoming minor premiers, however it was East Ringwood who progressed straight through to the Grand Final after defeating Croydon by just 1 goal. East Burwood Black were tough to beat all season, but it was the minor premiers who secured their spot in the Grand Final. The Grand Final certainly didn't disappoint. Competitive right to the end, East Ringwood achieved back-to-back Premierships.

Division 2 was hotly contested from the get-go and welcomed the return of Blackburn to the competition. Coldstream and Oakleigh District looked to be the two sides to beat, however Croydon North MLOC, Knox Falcons and 2022 Division 3 premiers East Ringwood continued to be challenging contenders. The finals series didn't disappoint, with margins remaining under 10 goals. Minor premiers Coldstream had a shaky start to the final's series, losing to Oakleigh District in the semi-finals. They came back strong to defeat Knox and secure their place in the Grand Final where they became 2023 Division 2 premiers.

The Division 3 finals series saw Heathmont White, minor premiers, continue their dominance of the season. Lilydale also had a terrific season, finishing second and the only side to defeat Heathmont White during the home and away season. Unfortunately, Lilydale couldn't break through Heathmont's clinical performance in the Grand Final, losing to Heathmont by 18 goals.

Division 4 had a formidable top 5, with Montrose, Oakleigh District and Kilsyth only separated by a few percent. The finals series provided a great opportunity for all teams, but it was Vermont who went back-to-back by defeating a strong Montrose team by only 4 goals.

Division 5 was another hotly contested season, with only a few wins separating the top 4 teams. Park Orchards who had a successful season started the finals series strong, defeating Balwyn to progress to the Preliminary Finals. They would meet minor premiers Silvan, who had a shock loss during the semi-finals.



Determined to make up for this, Silvan, who were strongly challenged by Park Orchards, narrowly secured their place in the Grand Final where they would become premiers.

In Division 6 the strongest four sides were Glen Waverley, Chirnside Park, East Ringwood and Vermont. It was difficult to separate these teams, and finals were again a tight contest. Minor premiers Glen Waverley progressed straight through to the Grand Final where they versed Chirnside Park who played 2 challenging matches to secure their place. In another close Grand Final match, Glen Waverley continued to play consistently in all 4 quarters to defeat Chirnside Park by 8 goals.

Division 7 saw several close contests, with an equal finish for top spot decided by percentage. Waverley Blues and Montrose had a close first match in finals, decided by only 2 goals. Waverley Blues played an exceptional match in the Preliminary finals to defeat a confident Coldstream side following their convincing win in the semifinal. Waverley and Montrose would both meet again in the Grand Final, but it was Waverley Blues who shot the winning goal in the last 3 seconds of the match to become Division 7 premiers.

Division 8 was highly competitive from Round 1, seeing the top 4 sides separated by just 2 wins. Montrose caused an upset in the Semi Finals, defeating minor Premiers The Basin to progress straight through to the Grand Final. Waverley Blues continued their winning momentum, defeating The Basin in the Preliminary Finals by just 2 goals. Their winning streak unfortunately came to an end, with Montrose defeating them by 15 goals in the Grand Final.

Division 9 had a strong top 4, with Norwood Gold quickly becoming the side to beat. They finished minor premiers, only suffering one loss for the season. Their strong connection on court continued throughout the final's series, however Chirnside Park, having finished 3rd and defeating 2nd placed Montrose in the Preliminary Finals, who played exceptionally during the Grand Final. The match went goal for goal, but it was Norwood who held on to win by the narrowest of margins, 1 goal to become premiers in their return to the competition.

Awards included Best & Fairest, Leading Goal Shooter and Team of the Year, highlighted on social media and on the night. THE 2023 EASTERN FOOTBALL NETBALL LEAGUE SEASON SAW THE CONTINUED DEVELOPMENT AND EXPOSURE OF OUR LEAGUE FROM A MEDIA PERSPECTIVE.

Footy returned home in 2023, with the return of Radio Eastern 98.1FM's live coverage on Saturdays. The return strengthened the connection between the league and the broader community.

EFNL Match of the Rounds had an increase in viewers this year on both our Facebook and YouTube live streams of the weekly games. The league covered a senior men's match every Saturday, as well as the occasional Sunday game and marquee matches such as the Good Friday and Anzac Day clashes.

With a priority of covering as many different teams as we could, we made some excellent ground on this in 2023. For the first time, the media van made its way down to Princes Highway Reserve to cover Oakleigh District in a Division 3 Match of the Round. Other clubs such as Bayswater, North Ringwood, Scoresby and Fairpark had their first taste of live coverage since 2019.

Our live coverage of the Deakin University Senior Women's competition continued again in season 2023. One game was streamed live every Saturday morning via our YouTube and Facebook pages. The coverage took on a couple of new levels, introducing a boundary rider for those senior women's games as well as pre-game and post-game interviews from both coaches and players.

Covering many senior womens sides for the first ever time, season highlights included a trip to Mount Waverley Reserve for the return of the Waverley Blues in the Deakin University senior women's competition, as well as covering Wantirna South in their first-ever season.

Over the course of the 2023 Finals Series, the league covered ten senior Grand Finals, five reserves Grand Finals, five Under 19.5 Grand Finals, two veterans Grand Finals and an overall total of 28 finals covered across August and September.

The Premier Division Grand Final between Rowville and Vermont at Bayswater Oval had over 23,000 tune in on our Facebook and YouTube streams.

Via LKLM Media, who work tirelessly each week alongside Sportscast Australia to produce footage for all senior men's games, the finals series saw the introduction of drone footage. Across the Grand Finals, we had some fantastic footage from the drone, capturing moments within the game as well as the end-of-game celebrations. It helped assist in bringing the fantastic atmosphere that we had from each Grand Final to your living room screens at home.

This year, there was another big push to increase the quality of our work on the EFNL social media pages. Part of that was focused on our graphics, including Match of the Round promotion, Grand Final edits and general weekly posts to engage with followers.

Throughout the season, we saw significant reach and promotion of the league across our major platforms. We reached over 22.4 million people on Facebook and Instagram. The EFNL Website also had major traction, reaching 27 million people. Monthly website traffic to the website was an average of 3.8 million this year.

In the second half of 2023, we added to our weekly coverage on our social platforms through video interviews with players and coaches on multiple different aspects of the league. This included coverage across NAIDOC week with multiple clubs wearing Indigenous designed jumpers.

Whitehorse FNC welcomed us to their facilities to introduce their designed jumper that was worn by both the senior men and women sides during NAIDOC week.

We were also fortunate enough to sit down with Jamie Bennell from Norwood and Brayden Kilpatrick from South Croydon to hear what the jumper and the round meant to them. The annual clash between the two sides was showcased in our Match of the Round for the second year running, held at Cheong Park for the first time.



Clubs have been very welcoming to the members of the media team, allowing us to come down to training sessions and granting access to players for interviews. We'd like to thank those clubs for their participation throughout the year and we look forward to producing similar content again in the 2024 season.

This season, we also teamed up with Limitless Digital, who assisted throughout the finals series to put together social media graphics and tiles for the Team of the Year and league best and fairest awards, presented at Chandler Medal.

There are many people involved behind the scenes, each and every week that do a fantastic job. Without them, it would be impossible for me to do my job and they should be extremely proud of what they have achieved time and time again.

Firstly, to LKLM Media, taking on the audio as well as the camera work of not just the weekly Saturday matches, but presentation nights as well as everything that is involved with Grand Final weeks.

Umpiring

In season 2023 we embarked on an extensive recruitment campaign to not only draw new people to the game, but to also bring back those that may have stepped out for a few seasons. Our goal this year was to grow our overall numbers so that we can start to rebuild our pathway programs and advance people in our game as umpires.

This year saw 260 new people join umpiring, by far the largest recruitment numbers I have seen in my time and this took our total for the first time to be above 600 registered umpires in a season. This was achieved by a strong league marketing campaign combined with great junior football club support to promote the recruitment message. We then delivered regular structured coaching sessions and programs and followed up with consistent feedback via match day observations and communication.



The results for the season around appointment fill rates mean't that in our junior games we managed to fill 97% of the games with their allotted umpire requirements. This is an amazing outcome as we all know it can be a challenge to have everybody available each week. Sean Clarke (Junior Umpires Head Coach) and his team have done a fabulous job this year to achieve this result.

This season we have seen around 90 umpires transition from Sunday junior umpiring to our Seniors on Saturdays in both our Men's and Women's football competitions in either field, boundary, or goal umpiring.

Whilst our numbers increased, we still have, like many clubs, challenges around availability. A number of umpires double up or just do extra games to make sure that a game of football goes ahead.

Overall, the performance by our umpires in the 2023 Junior / Senior home and finals series was strong.

The finals series saw a great mix of youth and senior appointments to finals games, and they all performed well. As we move to be more predictable amongst each other as umpires, we will see the team aspect grow and give us a higher and more consistent level of umpiring in the EFNL.

I would like to thank our senior coaching team in Bruce Onken, Nathan McDonald and Katrina Stopinski, the boundary coaching team in Des Seaton, Trevor Finch and Pieter Van Pinxteren and the goal coaching team in Peter Baldry and Warren Sidebottom for their support in coaching and providing feedback to the umpires throughout the season. Our coaching numbers increased, and this has certainly contributed to the development and growth of the entire umpiring group.

Our junior program, under the guidance of Sean Clarke with the assistance of Graeme Meredith and Gerard Bolton and the inclusion of three new assistant coaches in Brodie Renshaw, Liv Heinen and Jordan Kennedy, continues to produce quality young umpires who will eventually step up into Seniors when Sean Clarke thinks they are ready.

The task of filling over 360 appointments each Sunday is huge and very rarely was there a game that didn't have at least one field umpire, so this is a mighty effort and cannot be understated.

Year in Review

OCTOBER 2022

EFNL's Netball Events and Administration Manager Petra Keogh calls time on her tenure after five years with the league.

NOVEMBER

EFNL announces the 2023 Eastland Senior Men's Fixtures, ahead of all other surrounding suburban leagues.

The EFNL held its Annual General Meeting on the 30th of November at Jubilee Park, the first time in person since 2019.

DECEMBER

Jy Bond is appointed by the Eastern Football Netball League Board as the league's new Chief Executive Officer. Bond brings to the role a wealth of football and corporate experience, having held positions as National Player Development Manager at Professional Footballers Australia, State Talent Manager at AFL Tasmania, Talent Manager at Western Jets and Regional Talent Operations Manager at the Oakleigh Chargers.

Kirsty Jamieson is named as Administration and Events Manager, taking over the role from Petra Keogh.

JANUARY 2023

EFNL life member and former board member Bruce Peak passes away. Peak was heavily involved with the Ringwood Football Club before joining the league as a board member. Peak was recognised for his outstanding service to the league by being granted life membership to the EFNL in 2012.

FEBRUARY

EFNL Chief Executive Officer Troy Swainston completes his tenure with the league after four years in the role.

The "InFocus" feature series begins with previews for each senior club. The series hears from all senior men's and women's coaches of the league ahead of the 2023 season.

MARCH

After fifteen years of wonderful service, Graham Halbish steps down from his role of Chair of the EFNL Board. Halbish remains a member of the Board, while Paul Barlow is announced as his replacement, elected to the position of Chair. A fantastic appointment, with Barlow having served on the Board over the last seven years.

Tim Finemore also steps down from his role as Deputy Chair, remaining on the board while board member Kevin Smith takes his role.

The 2023 Bendigo Bank Netball season kicks off on Friday, 31st of March with a total of nine divisions in the competition.

APRIL

The 2023 Junior and Senior football competitions begin over the first week of April.

All promoted senior men's Premiers from 2022 (East Ringwood, South Belgrave, Waverley Blues and Silvan), started the 2023 season with wins in their new divisions. The Premier Division 2023 Grand Final rematch was also held in Round One, between Noble Park and Rowville. Eventual Chandler Medallist Jackson Sketcher stole the show as he led the Bulls to a come from behind win, with 49 disposals and four goals.

The division structure of the Senior Women's competition is revealed, with two major changes. The Premier Division returned to one full competition after last year's Premier A and Premier B divide. Meanwhile, Division Three and Four are trialled through a three-game grading period before the final divisions are announced, creating a more even competition at both levels.

Balwyn and Blackburn played off in the annual Good Friday clash, this time held at Balwyn Visy Park. For the second year in a row, the Tigers took home the chocolates, the win set up after a dominant opening half. Waverley Blues also hosted Mulgrave in another Good Friday blockbuster, the Blues running out 74-point winners.



MAY

League life member James 'Jim' Walker passes away. Walker served many years as a member of the EFNL Board and a Vice President of the league. Walker was heavily involved with the Mitcham Football Club, a member of the club's junior committee in the late 80's. In 2015, Walker was awarded life membership with the EFNL, rewarded for his services to the league.

Alongside other leagues, the EFNL took part in the Pink Sports Round, raising funds and awareness for the Breast Cancer Network Australia foundation. Heightening the awareness of the cause, players across both the Football and Netball competitions all wore pink as well as the umpires in the broadcasted Match of the Rounds.

The league also continued its partnership with the Victorian Responsible Gambling Foundation, continuing to promote the importance of enjoying the game and not the odds.

Beloved member of the Eastern Devils Brooke Fox, celebrated an almighty achievement, reaching her 300th game milestone. Fox became just the fifth Victorian woman to reach the milestone. The Devils celebrated her big milestone game with a thrilling five-point win over Kilsyth.

The 2023 AFL Victoria Junior Development Series kicked off on the 31st of May with the EFNL fielding six teams made up of 160 of the league's best Under 14 and 15 girls & boys. The series was well supported by Interleague partners - Hawthorn Football Club, SEDA, Project Gap and Field of View.

The league hosted home games for the Under 15 Boys at Tormore Reserve and the Under 15 Girls at Mulgrave Reserve. The Boronia and Eastern Devils Football Clubs putting together a great evening in difficult conditions.

JUNE

The AFL Junior Development Series continued over the King's Birthday Weekend, the league hosting games once again at Walker Park, Mitcham. Over the course of the series, the EFNL took on other state leagues including the Yarra Junior FL, Riddle JFL, Essendon District FL, South Metro JFL and Western Region FL.

The series was a great success, with EFNL sides winning 13 of the 18 games they participated in. Both Under 15 Girls sides and the Under 14 Division One Boys went through the series undefeated. All home games were streamed live on the EFNL YouTube page by LKLM Media and Sportscast.

Once again, the league showed their support of The Big Freeze with clubs supporting Fight MND by donating to the cause.

The annual King's Birthday clash saw traditional rivals Balwyn and Noble Park face off, with the reigning premiers running away big winners against the Tigers. For the second year running, Mooroolbark and Montrose faced off in a standalone Division One game, the Demons reversing the result this year with a comprehensive win. Meanwhile, Chirnside Park and Scoresby both won games against Croydon North MLOC and Surrey Park.





Year in Review

JULY

The EFNL participated in the TAC's Road Safety Round, a coordinated state-wide fixtured round of football for all Victorian clubs. This year, the TAC Road Safety Round, participants from all clubs wore blue armbands to honour every life lost on the roads, and act as a reminder that we all have someone to drive safely for.

The league launched our inaugural Under 8 Girls competition, played at Kings Park, Upper Ferntree Gully. The free participation initiative was staged over four weeks, aimed to support the growth and development of female participation in football as well as bridging the gap between Auskick and the Under 10 Girls competition.

The competition was a great success with a total of 40 girls participating over the four weeks, developing their skills and having fun playing football.

South Croydon hosted Norwood in the annual NAIDOC week game, this time at Cheong Park. It's the third consecutive year that the two clubs have met for this occasion, with the two clubs wearing indigenous designed jumpers for the occasion.

East Burwood, Mitcham, Mulgrave, Rowville, Warrandyte, and Whitehorse also all had Indigenous jumpers designed for the round. Thanks to Carsales, the officiating umpires of the Match of the Round between South Croydon and Norwood, also had their uniforms uniquely designed for NAIDOC Round. Our Major partner in Eastland showcased each jumper and design over that week at a display inside the shopping precinct.

Silent Sunday is re-introduced into the junior competition and trialled for the final two rounds of the season. The initiative returned to give young players an opportunity to play the game without sideline input and to support the umpires who are officiating those games and developing their own skills at umpiring.

Junior Finals were announced with nineteen venues hosting finals in season 2023, with some venues hosting for the first time in their history.

The Eastland 2023 Senior Finals were also announced. Bayswater was once again selected to host the Premier division Grand Final of the Senior Men's competition for the 21st time this century. Boronia, Mitcham, and Ringwood were also selected to host senior men's Grand Finals once again in divisions one to three while East Ringwood were chosen to replace East Burwood for the Division Four Grand Final.

For the second year running, North Ringwood, Heathmont and Silvan were all selected to host the 2023 Senior Women's finals series, running over three weeks.

The league announced a new partnership with MEGT Australia, local apprenticeship experts coming on board as a major sponsor.

AUGUST

EFNL Junior Grand Final day was held on Sunday 13th August, with ten clubs hosting 37 Grand Finals. Twenty four different clubs had at least one team represented, seventeen of those claimed a premiership.

Junior Presentation Night was held on 21st August at Crossways, East Burwood. Almost 1000 people were in attendance. The Ringwood Junior Football Club were awarded the Gordon Parker Best Conducted Club for 2023.

Quambee Reserve and H.E Parker Reserve played host to all five senior Women's Grand Finals and both Mens and Womens Veterans Grand Finals on the 26th of August.

The Eastern Devils tasted premiership glory for the second consecutive year in the Premier Womens Division, turning around a half-time deficit to win a memorable Grand Final by a margin of just three points.

Boronia, East Ringwood, Kilsyth and Mooroolbark all won their first-ever premierships since joining the Deakin University Senior Women's competition.

East Ringwood completed the perfect season, going through the Home and Away season undefeated.

The Bendigo Bank Netball Grand Finals for Divisions One to Nine were held over two Friday Nights at H.E Parker. Division One saw East Ringwood celebrate back-to-back premierships, defeating Croydon in the Grand Final.



SEPTEMBER

The Surrey Park Football Club created history by winning their first-ever senior premiership since their merge, 28 years ago. They tasted success, a year after a losing Grand Final, defeating Kilsyth by 56 points at East Ringwood Reserve, kicking twelve of the last thirteen goals.

Donvale also found redemption in 2023, celebrating a sixty-point win over Ferntree Gully in the Division Three decider.

Boronia became the first-ever club to win both the senior men's and senior women's premierships in a single year, after the Hawks defeated the Jets by 32 points at Walker Park in Division Two of the Senior Mens competition.

In one of the great Grand Final upsets, Mitcham stunned the undefeated South Belgrave Saints in the Division One Grand Final. The Tigers held on for a five-point victory at Tormore Reserve, their seventeenth premiership in the league.

EFNL Team of the Year squads and final teams are released before Chandler Medal Evening.

Chandler Medal evening is held on Wednesday 13th September at Manningham Function Centre. Ellen Johnson from the Boronia Football Netball Club is presented at Chandler Medal Night as the inaugural winner of the Eastland 2023 Volunteer of the Year award.

Four greats of the league were awarded with their 300-game EFNL Life Membership, Scott Dimitriou, Daniel King, James O'Sullivan, and Grattan Stephens.

The Ringwood Football Netball Club also took home awards on the night, Craig Jackson was selected as the recipient of the 2023 Recognition of Service Award and Olivia Ashcroft won this year's Club Warehouse Senior Trainer of the Year.

The Eastland Premier Division Grand Final Day was played in perfect conditions at Bayswater Oval between Vermont and Rowville. In front of the biggest Eastern crowd since pre-COVID, the Hawks held on for a ten-point victory, their first-ever Premiership at the top level of the competition.

Hawks defender Jesse Eickhoff was recognised for his efforts in defence, awarded with the Cliff Tomkins Medal.

OCTOBER

The league's Umpire Operations Manager Scott Van Noordennen is recognised at the AFL Victoria Community Awards as the Umpire Manager of the Year.

The inaugural EFNL Netball Summer competition launches on October 27th. The competition will run each Friday for ten weeks with Round Ten fixtured for January 19th. Twenty five teams have entered the summer competition across four divisions.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2023

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic), for use by the members of the league and to fulfil the board's requirements to prepare financial statements. The Association is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic) and the following Accounting Standards:

AASB 101	Presentation of Financial Statements
AASB 107	Statement of Cash Flows
AASB 108	Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors
AASB 110	Events after the Reporting Period
AASB 116	Property, Plant and Equipment
AASB 15	Revenue from contracts with customers

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

A) PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment loss.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Association and the cost of the item can be measured reliably.

All other repairs and maintenance are charged to the income statement during the financial period in which they are incurred.

The directors have assessed the current market value of the Association's land as at least \$490,000 based on the most recent Knox City Council valuation.

B) DEPRECIATION

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets is depreciated on a straight line basis over their useful lives commencing from time the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of assets are as follows:

Freehold Improvements	9% to 33%
Furniture and Equipment	20%
Computers	20%
Motor Vehicles	20%

C) REVENUE RECOGNITION

Sales Revenue

Sales Revenue represents revenue earned (net of returns, discounts and allowances) at a point in time from the sale of products and services. Sales revenue is recorded when the goods are dispatched.

Interest Income

Interest Income is recognised as it accrues.

Asset Sales

The profit or loss on disposal of assets is included as revenue of the Association. Such profit or loss on disposal of assets is brought to account at the date an unconditional contract of sale is signed.

D) INCOME TAX

The Association has been granted an income tax exemption by the Australian Tax Office.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENT

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

E) INVENTORIES

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. The cost is based on the first in, first out principle and includes expenditure incurred in acquiring the inventories and bringing them to their existing condition and location.

Net realisable value is determined on the basis of the company's normal selling pattern. Expenses of marketing, selling and distribution to customers are estimated and are deducted to establish net realisable value.

F) EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

G) GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

H) IMPAIRMENT OF ASSETS

At each reporting date, the Association reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the Association estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

I) COMPARATIVE AMOUNTS

Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

(J) NEW ACCOUNTING STANDARDS FOR APPLICATION IN FUTURE PERIODS

The AASB has issued new, revised and amended Standards and Interpretations that have mandatory applicable dates for future reporting periods and which the Association has decided not to early adopt. Due to the nature of the Association's activities, it does not expect them to have any material effect on the Association's financial statements.




